We wanted to follow up with you following the positive briefing sessions we had with Chairs and Heads of our respective CMATs recently.

It was good to join you as Directors and share in the updates to progress towards the establishment of the St Clare and St Francis of Assisi Catholic Multi Academy Trusts and the ongoing work to help inform how these are set up and will operate.

As Directors, we are grateful to all those that have worked so hard to get us to this point, but we recognise the responsibility we now have to make decisions which will shape the way our CMATs will develop. We are committed to developing a shared vision and set of values across two highly effective CMATs. St Clare and St Francis of Assisi Catholic Multi Academy Trusts will be sister and brother to one another, in the image of our patrons. We will not compete and we will always support one another. Where possible we will have Diocese wide policies and ways of working to help foster joint working. But we will also look to be distinctive - mirroring our different communities and parishes.

The Directors have had a number of discussions to help steer the programme over the summer and into the early part of next term. Working with the MAT development group and Schools Department we want to get a better handle on progress and the risks at school level as well as those at programme level. This will help us focus our efforts where they will make the most difference.

In the autumn term, we want to work with our schools to agree an approach to governance that is in keeping with the way we work in Hallam. We want to have strong local governance, supporting Chairs of Governors, Headteachers and staff to continue to make our schools living communities filled with the Gospel spirit of freedom and love and inspiring places to learn and work. We want to encourage continued support between schools at every level of the Diocese. We also want to look for ways that by working at a large scale - across a CMAT or across the Diocese - we can support all schools to flourish in what will continue to be uncertain times.

We hope you will support us on the next part of this journey; through your prayers for the success of our CMATs, through sharing your views and advice with us as we develop the vision and ways of working, and by continuing to lead your schools as you have done through these most difficult of times.
