Synod-Hallam News

For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission

A two-year 'synodal 'process is taking place in the Catholic Church from September 2021 that culminates in the final Synod Gathering of Bishops in Rome in October 2023. Synod means "journeying together.

"What's going on with this Synod in Hallam?"

This is Pope Francis' Synod question:

"How does this "journeying together," which takes place today on different levels (from the local level to the universal one), allow the Church to proclaim the Gospel in accordance with

the mission entrusted to Her; and what steps does the Spirit invite us to take in order to grow as a synodal Church?

Liturgy

After the celebratory launch liturgy on 17th October at 4.30 at St Marie's Cathedral, hopefully also to be live-streamed across the Diocese, the Synod Working Group will meet on 22 October at 7pm on-line. Contact us for the link.

The Synod Working Group: who are they and what will they be doing?

The purpose of the Synod Working Group is to plan, support and learn from listening to each other and our ideas about how to take the next steps in the Synodal process.

The invitation to join the Synod Working Group is for anyone.

The representatives from the Synod Working Group will be going back to their own parish or group, to think about, plan and organise ways of getting groups of people together to talk and listen to each other. This is to begin the prayerful process of formulating responses to Pope Francis' question.

What groups? Who is talking and listening to each other?

There are lots of groups, formal and informal, and different ways of getting together. You can arrange Synod Response Groups. Perhaps you are planning a Christmas Fair? Or a Coffee Morning? Or Friday Soup? Or a Walking Group? A Market Stall? Lectio groups, Rosary groups, SVP groups...

What are we supposed to be talking and listening about?

Take or create any opportunity to talk together and think about how your journeying together as Church is going and what way forward the Holy Spirit might be showing you. Gather up the responses, reflect on them together and see what common themes are emerging in your group and across different groups.

What do we do with the responses?

For the moment, we are concentrating on building up the conversations. As time goes on, we will need to think about how to discern together about where the conversations are directing us in

Hallam and the whole Church. We will then need to decide what we are feeding back to Bishop Ralph, for him to take to the Bishops Conference of England and Wales in 10 pages. They will take time to reflect and discern about what to take to Pope Francis at the Synod on synodality in 2023. However, the process of Synodality is not just a one off, for the purposes of producing a document, it is to see if we can walk together in solidarity into the future; synodality is the way of the Church in the 21st Century.

There is an email address for the responses of your groups synod@hallam-diocese.com, but don't be in a hurry to send in responses just yet. The important thing is to have the conversations for now. And to make sure that the invitation to talk and listen is open and welcoming to all, particularly those on the margins. How will you do that...?

Sounds like a big task?

You can be as involved as you want to, to use your gifts and your voice to contribute to the Synodal process. What is God calling you to?

You are not doing this alone.

You will not be alone doing this, there will be opportunities for talks and training on such things as "How to facilitate a group"; "Listening", "Discernment", "How to get people involved". Ask us for any help you might need. But the Holy Spirit is the powerful force supporting us in this work, so ask for help from the Holy Spirit also.

What's going on already?

The Diocesan Spirituality Group are already meeting to plan their involvement. Bishop Ralph is on with writing his homily for the liturgy on 17th October. Some parishes are getting themselves ready. Let us know what you have been doing if you would like it included in next months Newsletter.

COP26*1

The UK will host the 26th UN Climate Change Conference between 31st October to 12 November 2021 in Glasgow.

What is COP26 and why is it happening? (From <u>BBC.co.uk</u> News)

The world is warming because of fossil fuel emissions caused by humans.

Extreme weather events linked to climate change - including heatwaves, floods and forest fires - are intensifying. The past decade was the warmest on record, and governments agree urgent collective action is needed.

They all agreed in 2015 to make changes to keep global warming "well below" 2C above preindustrial levels - and to try aim for 1.5C - so that we avoid a climate catastrophe.

This is what's known as the **<u>Paris Agreement</u>**, and it means countries have to keep making bigger emissions cuts until reaching net zero in 2050.

UNFCCC (also called 'the Convention') was created in 1992 at the Earth Summit in Rio de Janeiro, and entered into force in March 1994. The Convention sets a framework for efforts by governments to tackle climate change, with the ultimate objective to stabilise greenhouse gases "at a level that would prevent dangerous anthropogenic (human induced) interference with the climate system". Almost all countries in the world have ratified, or agreed to be 'Parties 'to, the Convention.

At COP26, most countries will set out their plans to reduce emissions.

What can we do?

- Let your MP know of your concerns, particularly your concerns about how global warming effects the poorest societies the most.
- Pray that it will be a good meeting, with a just and compassionate outcome.
