Let us reflect how in the Eucharist we can bask in the radiance light of God's glorious presence Let us pray that we will welcome all to our Eucharist, rich and poor alike, troubled and joyful.

The angel of the Lord is encamped around those who revere him, to rescue them. Taste and see that the Lord is good. He is happy who seeks refuge in him.

Rejoice that at the Eucharist we pray in the company of the angels and saints Reflect on God's amazing gift of Eucharist, where we taste the goodness of the Lord
